

NPI Frequently Asked Questions

What is NPI? A National Provider Identifier (NPI) is a federally-issued, unique health care provider identification number.

Does every provider need an NPI? No. Some providers are considered “atypical” and do not need an NPI. Please refer to the NPI [Final Rule](#) on the CMS website to determine if you are an NPI-eligible health care provider.

What if I am an atypical provider? First Health Services will issue atypical providers a new provider number by 02/28/2007. This new number will be referred to as an API (Atypical Provider Number) and will contain 10 digits.

When should I register for my NPI? Register for your NPI as soon as possible.

Where do I register for an NPI? Go to <https://nppes.cms.hhs.gov> or call (800) 465-3203.

What is a taxonomy code?

A taxonomy code classifies a health care provider by service type and specialization.



A taxonomy code is not required to obtain an NPI, however, Nevada Medicaid will require one on all claims received from NPI-eligible providers beginning 05/23/07.

How can I report my NPI and taxonomy code to First Health Services?

First Health Services has sent a form to NPI-eligible Nevada Medicaid providers requesting their NPI and taxonomy code. You may complete and return this form, or use [form FH-33](#) on First Health Services website, <http://nevada.fhsc.com>.



I did not choose a taxonomy code when I registered for my NPI. What should I do now? Go to <http://www.wpc-edi.com/codes/taxonomy> and select one.

Report the taxonomy code to First Health Services and to the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES) at <https://nppes.cms.hhs.gov> (follow the links to “View or update your NPI data”).

Can Nevada Medicaid advise me on how many NPIs I need or what my taxonomy code is? No, a provider must make those determinations. CMS strictly prohibits DHCFP and First Health Services from advising providers on enumerating and selecting a taxonomy code. The provider should enumerate pertaining to their business needs and all payers they will bill. Select a taxonomy code that accurately describes the services provided.

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Are there new claim forms? Yes. The CMS-1500, UB and ADA forms are changing in 2007. The new forms can be viewed at the following websites:

When should I begin using the new claim forms? The dates below apply to claims, voids, adjustments and re-submissions.

CMS-1500: First Health Services will accept the new form (“version 08/05”) beginning January 2, 2007. Versions 12/90 and 08/05 will both be accepted from January 2 – April 1, 2007. Claims received on or after April 2, 2007 must be on version 08/05.

UB: First Health Services will accept the new form (“UB-04”) beginning March 1, 2007. Versions UB-92 and UB-04 will both be accepted from March 1 – May 22, 2007. Claims received on or after May 23, 2007 must be on version UB-04.

ADA: First Health Services will accept the new form (“ADA 2006”) beginning January 2, 2007. Currently accepted form versions and the ADA 2006 will all be accepted from January 2 – May 22, 2007. Claims received on or after May 23, 2007 must be on version ADA 2006.

Should I include my 9-digit Provider Medicaid Number on the new forms?

Yes, until May 22, 2007. All claims received before May 23, 2007 must include the 9-digit Provider Medicaid Number (Legacy ID).

Can I enter my NPI/API on claims before May 23, 2007?

Yes, you may enter it if available, however, the 9-digit Provider Medicaid Number will be used to process all claims received before May 23, 2007.

When is my NPI/API required on claims?

May 23, 2007. Per HIPAA, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) require all NPI-eligible providers to include their NPI on all standard electronic transactions effective 05/23/07. The Nevada Division of Health Care Financing and Policy (DHCFP) will also require NPI on paper claim submissions, effective 05/23/07.

Atypical providers are required to enter their 10-digit API issued by First Health Services on all claims received on or after May 23, 2007.
