COVID-19 UNWIND:

COVID-19 Prior Authorization Requirements Changing

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services is ending the COVID-19 public health emergency on May 11, 2023. All flexibilities will also be ending on May 11, 2023, as published in <u>Web Announcement 3049</u>. The flexibility that waived prior authorization requirements related to COVID-19 testing and treatment is included in the changes (see Item #17 in the COVID-19 Unwind – Nevada Medicaid 1135 Flexibilities Table in Web Announcement 3049). Therefore, starting on May 12, 2023, any prior authorization requirements for COVID-19 testing and/or treatment, such as hospital admissions or continued hospital stay, will be reinstated. For example, if a recipient is admitted to a hospital for an inpatient stay on May 5 and is still in the hospital on May 11, and a continued stay is expected, a prior authorization will be required for the continued stay starting May 12.
