Justice Involved Reentry Initiative: Eligible Provider Types

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 (CAA, 2023) section 5121 addresses Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) requirements for certain recipients who are incarcerated. Effective January 1, 2025, under this Act, Medicaid and CHIP will provide Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) medical and behavioral health screening and diagnostic services for eligible juveniles within 30 days of their release from an institutional setting. These recipients are also entitled to 30-day pre- and post-release targeted case management (TCM) services.

The following provider types (PT) will be eligible to enroll with Medicaid to offer these services:

- PT 14 – Behavioral Health Outpatient Treatment
- PT 20 – Physician, MD., Osteopath, D.O.
- PT 22 – Dentist
- PT 24 – Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN)
- PT 26 – Psychologist
- PT 54 – Targeted Case Management (TCM)
- PT 77 – Physician's Assistant (PA/PA-C)
- PT 82 – Behavioral Health Rehabilitative Treatment

Participating providers performing EPSDT screening services are expected to follow guidelines per the scope of their license and the Medicaid Services Manual (MSM).
