Nevada Medicaid Web Announcement 3829

New Specialty to be Created Under Provider Type 85 for Medicaid Health Home for Beneficiaries with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)

Per Assembly Bill 137, passed during the 82nd Nevada Legislature (2023), Nevada Medicaid will be creating a new specialty under provider type 85 (Applied Behavior Analysis): specialty 320 (Medicaid Health Home for Beneficiaries with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder [FASD]). This specialty will be available for enrollment beginning February 17, 2026, and will provide services to recipients with FASD under the Medicaid Health Homes benefit, which allows recipients to remain living in their home or community-based setting.

Under this specialty, the following health home services are covered:

- Comprehensive care management
- Care coordination
- Health promotion
- Comprehensive transitional care and follow-up
- Individual and family support
- Referral to community and social services

Nevada Medicaid recipients will be considered eligible for this benefit if they have confirmed probable prenatal exposure to alcohol through clinical or self-attestation and/or have a diagnosis associated with the following ICD-10 codes: P04.3 or Q86.0.

Once PT 85 specialty 320 is available in the [Provider Flex](#) tool, eligible providers may backdate their enrollment effective date to October 1, 2025. All enrollment requirements will be listed in the [Provider Enrollment Information Booklet](#).

When a provider is enrolled and able to submit claims, they must also submit the PT 85 Specialty 320 Eligibility Checklist with the initial claim for the recipient. Subsequent claims will not require the checklist. Providers must also follow any other billing requirements described in the billing guide. The Eligibility Checklist and the new Billing Guide for this specialty will be posted on the [Billing Information](#) page when available.
