Medicaid Services Manual Chapters Updated

The following Medicaid Services Manual (MSM) chapters have been updated and posted on the Nevada Medicaid website:

- MSM Chapter 100 – Medicaid Program (effective July 29, 2026)

Nevada Medicaid has adopted revisions to Medicaid Services Manual (MSM) Chapter 100 – Medicaid Program. These revisions were heard and approved through the Public Hearing process pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 422.2369 on **July 28, 2026**, and became effective **July 29, 2026**.

The adopted changes include updating Sections 102, Provider Enrollment – Conditions of Participation, 102.1 Provider Enrollment – Request for Enrollment, Re-enrollment, and Revalidation - Conditions of Participation, and 102.2 All Providers and Applicants – Conditions of Participation (3). Updated to the NVHA's applicable divisions throughout the chapter. Changed references from Division of Health Care Financing and Policy (DHCFP) to Nevada Medicaid throughout the policy to align with Senate Bill (SB) 464. Added change from Division of Welfare and Supportive Services (DWSS) to Division of Supportive Services (DSS) throughout the chapter.

- MSM Chapter 1200 – Prescribed Drugs (effective August 3, 2026)

Nevada Medicaid has adopted revisions to Medicaid Services Manual (MSM) Chapter 1200 – Prescribed Drugs. These revisions were heard and approved through the Public Hearing process pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 422.2369 on **July 28, 2026**, and became effective **August 3, 2026**.

The adopted changes include updating refill quantity requirements for GLP-1s maintenance medications; Removed Actiq® (fentanyl citrate transmucosal lozenge) from Narcotic Analgesic and Combinations as it is discontinued commercially; Removed Viekira Pak® (ombitasvir, paritaprevir, ritonavir tablets, dasabuvir tablets) from Anti-Hepatitis Agents as it is discontinued commercially; Removed Kynmobi® (apomorphine) from Anti-Parkinson's Agents as it is discontinued commercially; Renamed Section GGGG. to Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) and removed Relyvrio® (sodium phenylbutyrate/taurursodiol) from the section as it is no longer on the market; Renamed Section JJJJ. to Primary Biliary Cholangitis (PBC) Agents and removed Ocaliva® (obeticholic acid) from the section as it is no longer on the market; Updated formatting for Bile Acid Agents.

- MSM Chapter 4100 – Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services and Coverage (effective July 29, 2026)

Nevada Medicaid has adopted revisions to Medicaid Services Manual (MSM) Chapter 4100 - Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services and Coverage. These revisions were heard and approved through the Public Hearing process pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 422.2369 on **July 28, 2026**, and became effective **July 29, 2026**.

The adopted changes include aligning policy with language from the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) 4th Edition to promote consistency across policy and certification requirements. ASAM is making the

following changes: outpatient level of care (LOC) 1.0 is being renamed to 1.5; partial hospitalization program (PHP) is being renamed as High Intensity Outpatient Program (HIOP); and LOC 3.7 Withdrawal Management (WM) is being renamed to 3.7 Medically Managed Residential Treatment. Additionally, to align Medicaid policy to Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) requirements, policy revisions require PHP to be affiliated with a hospital or a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC).
